### Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)

The Job Corps Emergency Medical Technician career training program takes 7 to 9 months to complete and requires training in the following subject areas:

- Airways
- Patient Assessments
- Medical Emergencies
- Trauma
- Special Populations
- Operations

#### Certification:

Students who complete the Job Corps Emergency Medical Technician training program are eligible to receive the following certifications:

- Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)
- Health Care Provider (CPR)
- Blood-borne Pathogens
- Airborne Pathogens
- Incident Command System (ICS)
- Emergency Vehicle Operator Course (EVOC)

#### Program requirements:

Before entering the Emergency Medical Technician training program, students should:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Have a valid driver's license or no barriers to receiving a license while enrolled
- Have a First Responders Certification

#### Average length of training/work experience:

- 7 to 9 months

#### The salary range for various careers as an EMT is:

\$27,000 to \$32,000/year
